

## **OUR STRATEGIC GOALS**

In support of the Bendigo Health Strategic Goals we have identified the following goals for this plan:



Bendigo Health is committed to empower its consumers to improve their own health and wellbeing. The Fundraising Advisory Board wants to see expansion of wellness programs within the Gobbé Wellness Centre and will continue to support the mental health exercise program.

Holistic in approach, these programs are evidence based and make a genuine difference to the health and wellbeing of the patients who access them.

The annual Move for Mental Health fitness challenge does more than just raise funds, it prompts discussion and helps us to reduce stigma around mental health conditions, as well as promoting the benefits of exercise as both a prevention and a treatment for a range of health conditions.



For decades Bendigo Health Fundraising and Foundation has been supporting patients who need to travel for care. Nearly 5000 nights of low cost accommodation is provided each year and this has been delivered through the Raise the Roof campaign and ongoing commitment from the trustees. Our capacity to respond to this increasing need has been strengthened by the establishment of Bendigo Bank House, thanks to the Bendigo Bank Community Banking program and Exemplar Health. We will build additional accommodation on the land purchased by Bendigo Health next to our existing Nolan Street units.



Fundraising and Foundation will support the delivery of safe and effective care and services by continuing to fund specialised medical equipment, patient clothing and items that provide a level of comfort for our patients.

We will introduce a grateful patients' program to increase the support base to Bendigo Health.

We know play is children's work and is therapeutic for our paediatric patients. That is why we are raising funds to build a dedicated paediatric rehabilitation playground on our Lucan Street site next to Jenny's Early Learning Centre. This unique project will see children receive therapy from our skilled staff in a purpose-built outdoor environment alongside other children who are using the space for play. This will be an inclusive community asset for children of all abilities.



Bendigo Health relies on great staff to provide excellent care. Supporting the development of our staff through scholarships encourages improvements in the quality of care. We will work with the People and Culture team to identify scholarship opportunities that provide support where it is needed and aligned to strategy.

Philanthropic support provided by our community boosts staff morale as it is a powerful way to show them how much they are valued. Sharing the stories about the generosity of donors is one way to care for our staff as well as to promote the value of philanthropy.

### **OUR OPPORTUNITIES**

#### The Commonwealth Games 2026

Bendigo will be a host city and regional hub for the Commonwealth Games in March 2026. These Games will bring international and interstate guests to regional Victoria along with international media and a viewing audience in the tens of millions.

This creates an opportunity to reach a new audience and to capitalise on the need for hosts to create unique and captivating events for the visitors. We will work with the City of Greater Bendigo to identify suitable events that fulfil a dual purpose of entertaining visitors whilst raising funds for Bendigo Health.

### Improve operational tools and processes

To support the delivery of this plan we need to use the resources we have effectively. This will be done through a variety of initiatives including a fit for purpose Customer Relationship Management System (CRM). Work began on this in the previous strategic plan and rolls over into this plan for completion.

The use of an updated CRM will allow us to provide a better experience for our donors and to support grateful patients in making a financial contribution to the health service. It will equip our team with the information they need and engage our growing supporter network.

We have seen outstanding results when we work with our community and enthuse them to raise funds on our behalf. We will expand our connections with fundraising champions who will tap into their networks and raise funds.

### **Increased regional footprint**

Bendigo Health is a regional health service with a catchment of more than 300,000 people, about a third of whom live in Bendigo. By increasing our region's awareness of Bendigo Health we can tap into a broader donor base. We will highlight the impact of giving to the regional health service without diminishing the need to also give locally. This will be done in a combination of establishing the grateful patient's program and working more closely with organisations based across the region.

### **Building a team of Clinical Fundraising Ambassadors**

The skills and knowledge of our clinical staff is an under-utilised opportunity. When our people use their passion about their specialty area to promote the impact of philanthropy for their patients and consumers we see increased engagement in that area.

Jenna Sing, Registered Nurse and Cancer Wellness Program Coordinator, was named the Fundraising Champion of the Year 2023, a national Fundraising Institute of Australia Award. Jenna often represents Bendigo Health at events to offer insights about the programs she runs using donated funds. This is a key ingredient in the success of fundraising for cancer wellness.

We wish to replicate this model for other areas and have begun this work with the paediatric rehabilitation area. We will give our staff the tools to become fundraising ambassadors, sharing their knowledge and experiences of the joy we can bring by working together to improve our services.



### MEASURING OUR PROGRESS AND SUCCESS

We will track our progress against this plan using the following measurable outcomes:

- An increase to the number of donors recorded in the CRM
- · A 10 per cent increase in revenue each financial year
- Review of demand for wellness programs and trends over time
- Revenue from community led fundraisers to show increase year on year
- Progress towards the construction of new patient accommodation as follows:
  - o Design completed and approved
  - o Planning permit issued
  - o Ouote received
  - o Fundraising appeal launched with appropriate target aligned to quote for construction
- Deliver a capital fundraising appeal for a dedicated outdoor paediatric rehabilitation play space. Complete construction and open on the Lucan Street site.

We will analyse new opportunities and weigh up the return on investment. This analysis will include a holistic view of everything required to execute the initiative. That is:

- Profitability
- Brand alignment and marketability
- Other strategic rationale
- Health benefits such as getting active, eating healthy, positive health messages.

#### How we will raise the funds

We will nurture and expand awareness for philanthropic opportunities to support Bendigo Health. We will raise our funds through the following key fundraising segments:

- Regular Giving including Workplace Giving
- Events
- Corporate Sponsorship, Philanthropic Trusts and Grants Program
- · Community-led fundraising

- Individual Giving and Bendigo Health signature Appeals Christmas, Move for Mental Health and aligned national campaigns.
